AN EVENING OF TAIZÉ PRAYER

A Taizé prayer service is designed for people of all Christian Traditions. It is a meditative chants sung repeatedly and rich silence. Using just a few words, the songs express a basic reality of faith, quickly grasped by the mind. As the words are sung over many times, this reality gradually penetrates the whole being. Thus, it becomes a way of listening to God.

The Taizé Community is an Ecumenical Christian monastic community in Taizé, Saône-et-Loire, Burgundy, France. It is composed of more than one hundred brothers, from Catholic and Protestant traditions, who originate from about thirty countries around the world.

ANOINTING MASS

March 14th | 2:00 PM | Church We will be celebrating the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at a



special Mass with anointing. Open to all who wish to receive the healing grace offered through this Sacrament. We encourage family & friends to join with those to be anointed.

FASTING REGULATION: On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, those who are 18 but not yet 60 are allowed only one full meal. Two smaller meals are allowed as needed, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

<u>ABSTINENCE REGULATION</u>: Those who are 14 years of age or older are to abstain from meat on all the Friday's of Lent.

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Ash Wednesday & Good Friday are universal days of both fasting and abstinence from eating meat. Abstinence is also observed on all Fridays of Lent. Catholics age 14 & older are bound to observe abstinence regulations except for serious reasons; Catholics ages 18-59 are bound to observe fasting regulations except for serious reasons. For all other weekdays of Lent, the Church encourages fasting, either in the traditional sense of through some other form of self-denial determined by conscience. Other devotions, such as the Stations of the Cross, the rosary, scripture study, participation in daily Mass, & service to those in need, are strongly recommended.
